



## **Covid 19 – Safeguarding and Child Protection Addendum**

### **LSCP SUPPORT & VULNERABLE PUPILS**

All updated advice from the LSCP will be taken in to consideration and where necessary acted upon.

Any staff in school during the provision for Key Workers should follow the safeguarding and child protection procedures as set out in the school's policy.

Attendance and vulnerable pupil data will be forwarded to the LA each week according to their deadlines.

If the school has any 'vulnerable pupils' they should inform the LSCP weekly as to their situation. This should follow contact with the family and the vulnerable child by phone.

There may be children that do not fall into the 'vulnerable' definition where the school nevertheless has concerns about and these should be monitored as best as possible. This could include feedback from teachers on their engagement with online work and any comments they may make that could be significant.

### **SAFEGUARDING & CHILD PROTECTION FOR KEY WORKERS' CHILDREN IN SCHOOL**

Any child in the school at the time of shutdown shall be treated in the same way as normal school operating hours in terms of their care and safety. Supervision should be thorough and follow school guidelines.

Safeguarding expectations and procedure for any workers, visitors or staff at the school will remain in the same format as stated in the School's Child Protection and Safeguarding Policies, as for normal school hours.

Mr Robert Yates, DSL, will be available at all times when there are pupils in attendance. He may also be assisted by Miss K Shipley, Deputy DSL, when she is in attendance.

### **PUPILS WORKING ONLINE**

Online safety is of utmost importance during this time when pupils are working remotely from home. The same Acceptable Use, Behaviour and Anti-bullying Policies remain in place for pupils even when working from home. Advice, guidance and further support from CEOPS and other online safety websites have been forwarded to parents.

The school continues to monitor work and use of the school's online platform and ensures it proper use, although the school's filters are not effective away from School premises.

Any staff who have concerns either in School or with online activity must report their worries to the DSL without fail.
